
Inside this Issue...

STATE INSPECTIONS

The State Board inspectors in most states are looking for the following things when they visit or inspect your facility.

- 1. Copy of license for all licensed employees.
- 2. ID tags on bodies that are at the funeral home.
- 3. GPL and casket/vault price list must match (ie same minimum and maximum casket price)
- 4. Copy of permits and authorizations on cremations.
- 5. Make sure that the reason for embalming is stated if used.


Eddy Dryden '67, owner of Dryden Funeral Home in Heflin, AL died April 9, 2005 at the age of 66.
