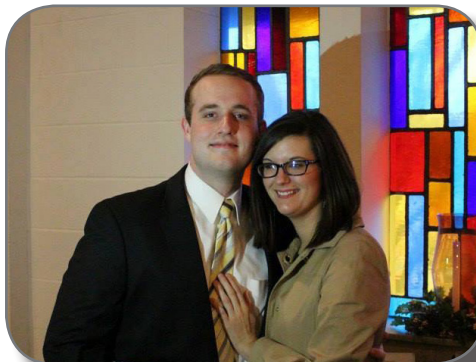
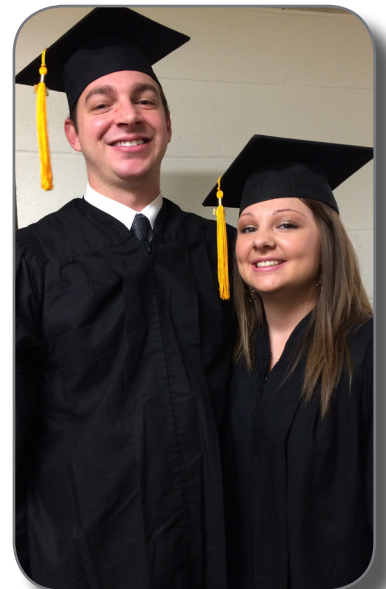
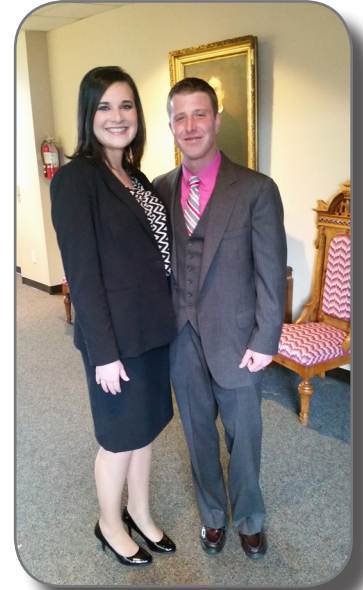

Bob Arrington, CCO, founder and president of Arrington Funeral Directors in Jackson, TN, is the 2014-15 president-elect of the National Funeral Directors Association. Bob became interested in funeral service when his grandfather died in 1963. His neighbor owned a funeral home, and he spent time there helping out after school and on weekends.

After completing mortuary science school, he received his funeral directors license in 1978, and his embalmers license in 1979. In 1995, he founded Arrington Funeral Directors.

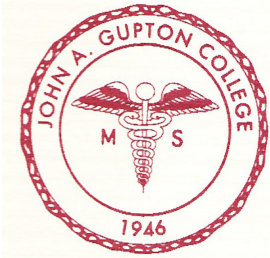


Bob has served his profession by taking on leadership roles with the Tennessee Funeral Directors Association (TFDA) and NFDA. He has served on numerous TFDA committees and the association's Board of Directors; his service on the TFDA Board of Directors included terms as secretary/treasurer, vice president and president.

On a national level, Bob served as Tennessee's representative to the NFDA Policy Board. For the past two years, he has served as an at-large representative, secretary and treasurer on the NFDA Executive Board. He has served as a member of NFDA's Governance, Audit, Budget, Spokesperson and Pursuit of Excellence committees.

He is a member of The Heritage Club, a supporter of the NFDA Political Action Committee and served as Tennessee's fundraising chair for the Funeral Service Foundation.

Landon "Grump" Byars Yarbrough, Jr., 81, passed away on the afternoon of October 11, 2014. Mr. Landon graduated from Byars Hall in 1951, joined the United States Army and spent two years in the military and then preceded to go to the John A. Gupton College in Nashville to obtain his Funeral Directors and Embalmers licenses in 1959.

After finishing school Landon worked for Maley Funeral Home in the sixties before purchasing the funeral home in 1970.

During his lifetime he has served as the Tipton County Sheriff twice when the active sheriffs passed away. He also served as the Tipton County Coroner for an extensive period of time. Mr. Landon was the owner of Maley-Yarbrough Funeral Home and the Covington Memorial Gardens. He was a member of the Shriners and Masons. Landon was a man that cared passionately for his family, always being there to support them and love them. He also cared deeply about his community, always wanting to be there for families in need. Mr. Landon was the biggest Tennessee Volunteers fan around and even attended the National

Championship game in 1998 to see Tennessee win its last championship. He loved to travel and camp with his wife Martha. Mr. Landon was survived by his wife, Martha Vincent Yarbrough of Covington; step-sons, Charlie (Becky) Moss and Leonard (Brenda) Moss of Covington; grandchildren, Charley Morgan (Gabe) Rivers of Atlanta, GA, Houston (Ginny) Moss and Allie Carol Moss of Covington; and a brother, Marion (Gail) Yarbrough of Covington.

A memorial service was held for Mr. Yarbrough on Wednesday, October 15, at 11AM at the Maley-Yarbrough Chapel. Visitation for Mr. Yarbrough was held on Tuesday night October 14th from 4-7.

KENNETH "KENT" KRESSENBERG

Kenneth "Kent" Kressenberg, of Chattanooga, went home to be with his Lord on Thursday, September 11, 2014. Kent was 61 years old.

Kent was born in Pulaski, Tennessee on March 24, 1953 the son of the late beloved newspaper columnist and Editor Bernice Kressenberg and one of Giles County's respected physicians Dr. Kenneth M. Kressenberg.

He was a 1971 graduate of Giles County High School. Kent worked in radio, and enjoyed being a photographer for the Pulaski News. He also owned and operated his own photography business. Kent received his AS Nursing Degree in 1984 from Columbia State Community College and was a dedicated nurse in Columbia and Chattanooga. He was a strong believer in the teachings of the Bible and sharing The Word to everyone. Kent was full on kindness and compassion and never met a stranger. He was a member at Woodland Park Baptist Church where he enjoyed taking medical mission trips to the Papa New Guinea Islands and all over the world. Kent then became a fully certified deacon in the Missouri Synodical Conference. He was a past member of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, and currently a deacon at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church where he fills in for the pastor at times. Kent continued his education by finishing Mortuary College at John A Gupton in Nashville in 2010. He has been employed with Chattanooga Funeral Home since 2009 where he has touched so many lives. Kent was a Ham Radio Operator, loved trains, and always had his camera for just the right moment. We will all miss our friend, his uplifting jokes, and words of cheer.

Kent was survived by his wife of 25 years, Regena Guy Kressenberg; his father, Dr. Kenneth M. Kressenberg and wife, Margaret; siblings, Karen Kressenberg and spouse Judy and Keith Kressenberg and spouse Gerri Lynn; nephew Brian and niece Heather.

The family received friends from 3 to 6 pm on Sunday at the North Chapel of Chattanooga Funeral Home and again from 1 to 2 pm on Monday at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church, 3204 Hixson Pike, Chattanooga, TN 37415. A celebration of Kent's life followed at 2pm on Monday at the church with his Pastor Barry Hildebrandt officiating. Kent was buried in Hamilton Memorial Gardens.
